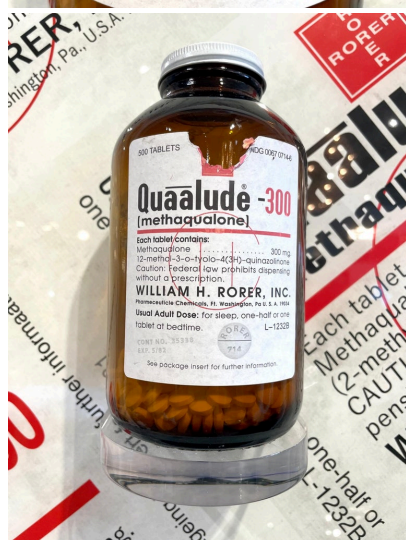
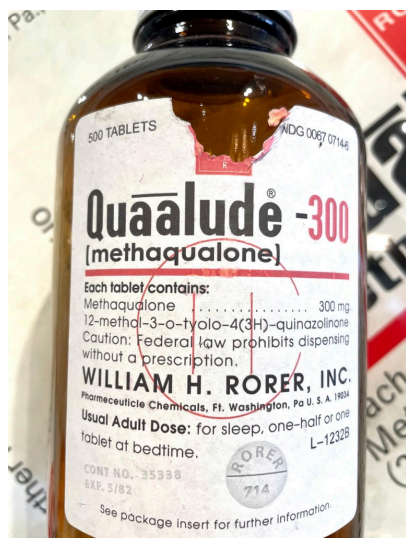


**VINTAGE POP ART ACRYLIC "QUAALUDES" W/ FAUX PILLS JAR**
