



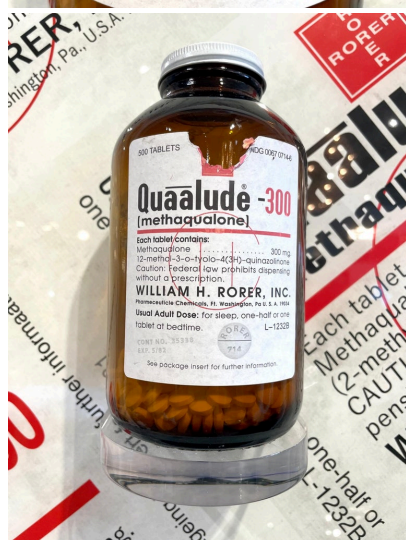
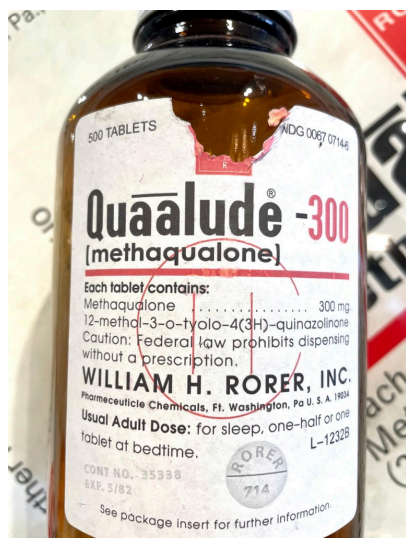
VINTAGE POP ART ACRYLIC "QUAALUDES" W/ FAUX PILLS JAR

In 1965, William H. Rorer Pharmaceuticals introduced it to the medical community as a safe barbiturate.
